Christmas and Domestic Violence

Christmas is a time of awe and wonder and family gatherings. Christmas trees and Santa Claus. Christmas Carols and nativity scenes. “Joy to the World” and “Here Comes Santa Claus.”



Did you ever wonder what a home with domestic violence looks like at Christmas?

I doubt if there are many carols playing. I am sure that the children aren't filled with wonder and awe. It's more like dread and fear. The family is praying that there's no family gathering this year because it always ends up in a big argument and somebody gets hit. Then Dad yells, “Let's get out of here!” The kids pile into the car not wanting to leave the cookies and candy behind. All the way home Mom and Dad argue. Dad yells as you go into the house, “Get to bed now.” Bed? It's 6:30 on Christmas Eve.

As the kids lay in bed in the quiet house, mom and dad continue to yell. Well, mostly Dad because mom doesn't open her mouth except to say, “Stop, don't hit me.” “Jack, please.” “The kids will hear.” There are loud noises going on.

The first thing to go was the Christmas tree. Dad knocked it over when he swung at the cat. She flew into the tree and dad got it. “That d----- cat! I told you to get rid of it. If I get my hands on it, I'm going to wring its neck.” “Oh no!,” the kids cry. “Here, Muffin. Come on girl!”, the kids say, frightened that the cat will get hurt. “Oh, dear, do you think Santa Claus will want to come to our house this year?”

You can still hear some swearing and mom weeping quietly. “I told you to shut up. If you want something to cry about, come here and I'll give you something to cry about.”

”Jack you've got to stop, it's Christmas Eve. Please, don't drink anymore. You've got to put the bikes together and Sally's dollhouse.” “Shut up, you whore. Why didn't you have your boyfriend put them together when he was over here the other night.” “Jack! What are you talking about? I don't have a boyfriend.” SMACK! Dad gets her in the eye. The noises go on long into the night.

After a while when it has been silent for a time, the children creep down the stairs to see what Santa Claus has brought them.

“Twas the night before Christmas and all through the house, not a creature was stirring, not even a mouse...”

Christmas can be a particularly harrowing time for people in abusive relationships as the pressures of financial difficulties, lost jobs, more alcohol around, and spending long periods of time with an abusive partner combine to create greater anxiety and stress. Add in then the tendency for violence and it makes it a not so very merry time of the year for victims and survivors of domestic violence.
